REACH and ROHS

Dear customer,

Many thanks for your inquiry concerning REACH and ROHS.

The REACH Regulation entered into force on 1 June 2007. Based on today's knowledge we may inform you that for all substances contained in our products we have taken the necessary actions.

As a downstream user we have informed our suppliers of the usage of the substances in our products so they can take this into account in their communication upstream.

Based on the information we have today we can inform you that our products contain none of the substances on the Candidate List. In case of changes in the future we will respect our role in the communication along the supply chain.

Concerning the use of certain dangerous substances in electrical and electronic equipment. (RoHS)

The European directive 2011/65/EC imposes the restriction or prohibition of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment, as from 21 July 2011. (RoHS). In order to comply with the EU ROHS legislation all of the substances mentioned below must either be removed, or must be reduced to within maximum permitted concentrations, in any products containing electrical or electronic components that will be sold within the European Union.

- Lead (Pb)
- Mercury Hg)
- Cadmium (Cd)
- Hexavalent Chromium (Cr6)
- polybrominated biphenyl (PBB)
- polybrominated diphenyl ether (PDBE)
